



ARKADAŞLIK İLİŞKİLERİNDE VE HAYATTA 2. ŞANS

- How are your children doing? Were they concerned about your problem or did they manage to take it calmly?

- In my opinion, blood donation has always been a common and normal thing to do. Therefore, making sure people in other countries can get some fundamental help by receiving blood fills my heart with joy. How do you feel about getting a cure for your issue by a stranger? Would you be proud and happy if you gave somebody else your blood to make their day, and maybe even save their life?

- All this time, I have never known what your problem was, and I'm quite curious about it. Why did you need blood donation? Was it a serious thing? Since when did you have this problem?

I'm doing much better now, thank you so much for asking! The recovery has had its ups and downs, but I'm feeling stronger and more hopeful every day. Knowing that someone out there cared enough to help me truly lifted my spirits.

My children were definitely concerned when they first heard out about my condition. It was hard for them to see me unwell. But over time, they learned to stay calm and be strong — especially after they heard I had a donor and was getting better. Your kindness gave them a lot of hope too.

It's honestly an incredible feeling. It made me believe in the goodness of people again. To be helped by someone I've never met — someone from another place in the world — is something I never imagined, and I carry that gratitude with me forever.

Yes, I would feel very proud. Now that I've been on the receiving end, I realize just how powerful a blood donation can be. If I could give someone the same second chance I was given, I would do it in a heartbeat.

I was diagnosed with a blood disorder that affected my body's ability to produce healthy cells. It became serious over the last year, and eventually, my doctors said that a blood or stem cell donation was the only real chance for recovery. I had been managing symptoms for a while before that, but the situation got worse recently — that's when your donation became so critical.
